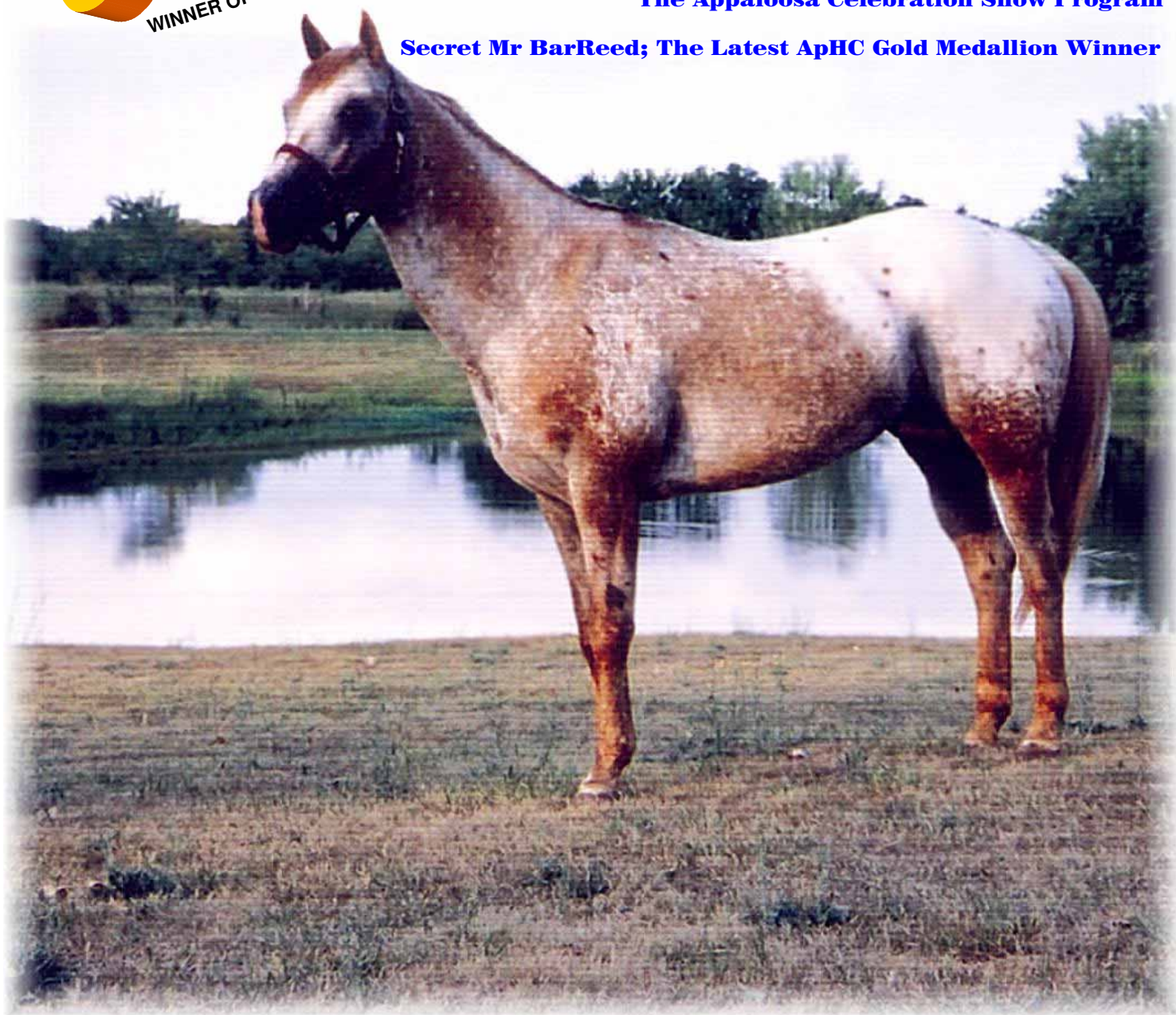

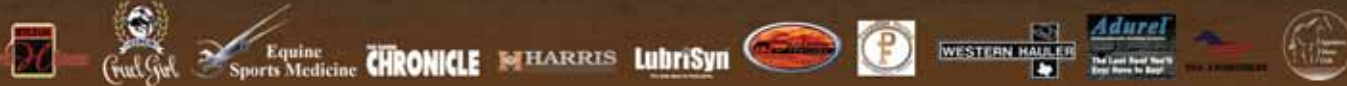

This month's cover features Appaloosa stallion, Secret Mr BarReed, owned by Sooner member Kim Rumpsa of Ware, Missouri. "Mister" is the ApHC's latest



Gold Medallion winner. The Medallion Program was created around 35 years ago, and to date, less than two dozen horses have earned a Gold Medallion. In 2001, "Mister" earned a Bronze Medallion in Performance; Green Hunter (year end). In 2002, he earned another bronze in Performance; Preliminary Jumping, also as a year end award. Then in 2004, Secret Mr BarReed earned a Silver Medallion in Competitive Trail Riding. The Gold Medallion was earned in 2006, in Halter (year end) in FPD Stallions. Since the creation of the Medallion Program, less than two dozen horses have ever earned the Gold. You can learn more about Secret Mr BarReed by visiting www.spotteddrumpranch.com. The ApHC Medallion Program was designed as a measure of an Appaloosa's versatility. There are four levels within the program; Bronze; Silver; Gold; Diamond Studded. Medallions can be earned in any of four categories; Halter; Performance; Race; Distance.

To earn a medallion in Halter or Performance, a horse must win it's class at the National or World Show or finish first in the top ten year end standings. A horse must complete 350 miles in the calander year to earn a medallion in Distance, while

the race medallions go to the top three horses in each age and sex category. The top three horses are figured on a formula taking the number of wins and multiplying that by the amount of money earned.

When a horse earns a medallion in one category, the horse is awarded the bronze. When the horse earns a medallion in a second category, the horse is awarded the silver. Earning a medallion in a third category earns the horse the gold. Earning a medallion in the fourth and final category earns the horse a diamond studded medallion.

Since the inception of the Medallion Program, no horse has earned a diamond studded medallion, and less than two dozen horses have earned the gold. This is why it's such an honor to have a Gold Medallion winner among the Sooner ApHC ranks. What makes it even more special is that Secret Mr BarReed is the only known living Gold Medallion winner.

Shortly after the last Sooner newsletter was mailed, we received word that Erica Halterman's good mare, Mama's Design, who had just won a two horse trailer, was stricken with EPM. While Mama's Design is recovering well, she still has a very long recovery period ahead of her. In the meantime, Erica has another mare to take her place in the show ring. We wish Erica and the rest of the Halterman family the best.

Meets A Lightning Bug B Fan, Ashley Coker, From Ash Flats, Arkansas

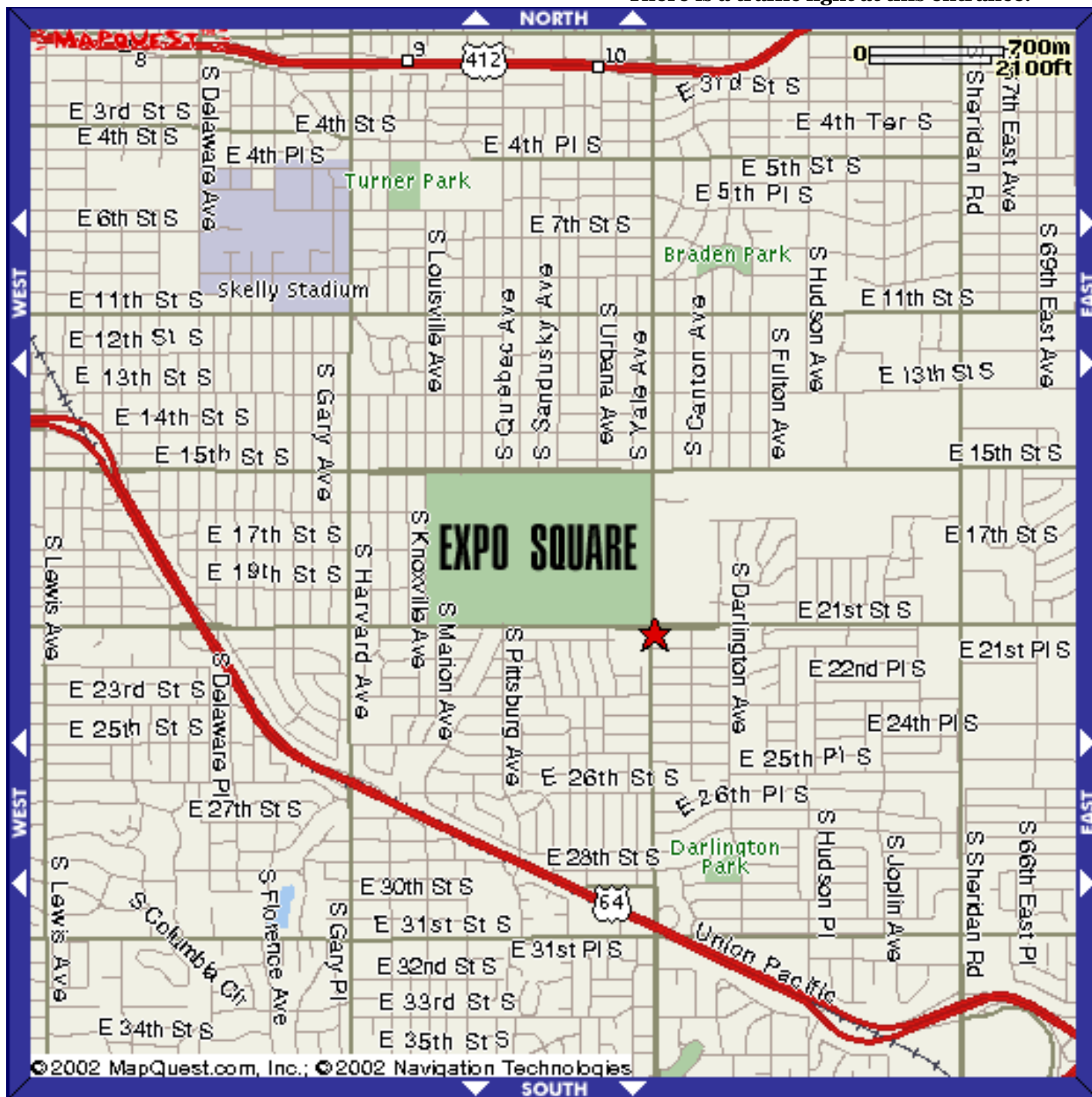

You all know how I love to talk Appaloosa History and share photos and stories! On the opposite page is my favorite photo of “you—know—who” taken by me in December, 1958 in the front yard of Roy and Naomi Wood’s place south of Chelsea, OK, where the Appaloosa stallions, Cherokee, Chief Chelsea, Oklahoma, Fiesta, etc, also lived.

In the background of that photo, to the left of Hands Up, is Highway 66, and it’s still there, but the white house was demolished a few years ago—made me feel bad. The pipe fence is long gone and the Wood’s home burned many years ago. The gate opening is fenced off too.

However, the huge pasture remains as always, and the pond bank is still intact where I’d swing up on Hands Up and ride him bareback. I rode him a few times in 1970 after Nolan Hutcheson bought him and stood him in Houston, MO after 1960.

The saddle, bridle, etc., were only days old and had been on only one other horse—my big black mare my parents gave me when I was eleven. She had my first Hands Up foal—a black filly. Our Tulsa home burned two months before, and with it, my cherished saddle which was my late grandfather’s.

My Aunt Alma handed me a blank check, told me to go to Mock Brothers Saddlery and ask Biff Davis to make a saddle to my specifications! My best friend, Martha, took me to Sand Springs, and for two months we’d go a couple time a week and drive Biff a little crazy to finish the saddle, etc. The total, including a new turquoise/white western shirt, came to a little over \$700. My aunt had told me not to go over \$1000.

I still have the saddle, etc., and friend, Gordon Williams, is going to put it on Bugs J Man one of these days as soon as I give the whole rig a good cleaning. Gordon is a huge part of the Bugs J Man story. He had seen AQHA Miss Ten Too in Glenpool, OK, and brought me her pedigree, grinning when he did!

The last time I used my saddle was on our big double bred Hands Up gelding who’s now owned by an Ohio family.

Time to saddle up, take new photos, and add more good memories to the Hands Up story!
