October 9th, 2004, Show Approaching Quickly By Dedra Tiger

As reported in the July newsletter, the June show was a big success. As summer comes to an end, I realized the October show is just around the corner. Where did the time go?

Volunteers Needed. As show manager, I reviewed the June show with an eye to what worked well and what needed to be improved. Most of the improvements relate to the number of volunteers working the show. We had some people that worked one position for 6 hours without a break. Others were not able to show their horses because there was no one to relieve them. As show manager, I don't want this to happen, again! These shows benefit the entire club and requires the participation of many members. By the time you read this article, I will have contacted you to work the October show. Thank you, in advance, to all who have volunteered. There are some real pluses to being a volunteer at the show: you're helping your Club promote the breed, you get to see some beautiful horses, and you get to meet some wonderful people, both competitors and other volunteers.

Fund raising. We've found that an easy way to gain support was to ask family, friends and folks like our vets, feed store owners, bosses, etc., to advertise by sponsoring ONE class for \$25.00. In other words, we are "selling" the class list. For their sponsorship, their name and city/state will be read at the start of the class and their name will remain on the Sooner website until 2005. Pretty good advertisement for \$25! You can get a class list from the Sooner site or contact Carol Johnson, Angie McGee, Nadia Loden or me. One of us can get you a copy. When you get a sponsor, let me know and I will add them to

the master list and the site.

Promote the show. We have the October show advertised in the "Southwest Horse Trader" and "Horse Sales and Tales". Our Internet gurus have been hard at work, advertising all over the Net. There will be flyers to "paper" your area of the country, very soon! If you would take a few into the shops where you purchase your horse commodities, other people will see them. We found that most every one would allow you to post flyers, even if they would not sponsor a class!

Silent Auction. The June "Silent Auction" will be hard to top, yet, we are well on the way to doing just that! The club needs your participation. We need quality items to put in the auction for October. The proceeds benefit the Sooner Youth and our general fund. Look around your house and tack room. You may have an item that another just cannot live without! When you find the "treasure" you would like to donate, please tell me so we can keep track of the auction items. All donors of auction items will be listed on the Sooner site until 2005, like the class sponsors



Minutes of May 19th Show Committee Meeting

Financial Report

Angie McGee went over the financial report dated April 15, 2004 to July 15, 2004. Beginning checkbook balance was \$591.39 with \$4,907.00 in deposits and \$3,214.38 in expenses, leaving a total balance of \$2,261.01. Upon motion made by Nadia Loden and seconded by Dedra Tiger, the financial report was approved.

Show Revenues

Angie McGee shared with the club the expenses and incomes of the show. The total cost of the Payne County Facility was \$1376.00. The club rented 46 stalls and had 6 tie outs. Paul Johnson noted an addition mistake of \$40.00 and the income from stalls/tie outs was \$950.00 instead of the \$980.00 presented. Total revenue is \$4,702.00 and total expenses are \$3,462.59 giv-

After going over the revenues, Angie reported to the club about past monies owed to members Carol & Paul Johnson and Cathey Hazelwood. The club currently owes Carol and Paul a total of \$1,048 and Cathey a total of \$304.77. Paul graciously suggested for the club to wait to pay them their expenses so that the club would have financial breathing room. The club voted to go ahead and pay Cathey the expenses owed to her in full.
